## WHY THE ROTARY PEACE CENTERS PROGRAM NEEDS YOUR DISTRICT'S SUPPORT

Each year, District Designated Funds (DDFs) enable up to 100 fellows from around the world to study peace and conflict resolution at one of the six Rotary Peace Centers. Nearly 1,000 alumni of the peace centers program are actively contributing to global peacebuilding, working in areas from grassroots initiatives to policy development at the United Nations and World Bank. Peacebuilder Districts support these peace leaders through their generous contributions.

## HOW TO BECOME A PEACEBUILDER DISTRICT

Peacebuilder Districts support the Rotary Peace Centers by allocating a minimum of \$25,000 annually in DDF donations. To maintain their Peacebuilder District standing, districts donate \$25,000 every year thereafter.
