WHEREAS, many clubs are only charging membership dues (RI, district, and compulsory magazine subscription), reducing or eliminating meals, and using other sources of funding for club administration and Foundation giving, and

WHEREAS, membership dues can represent a significant part of income in countries where average wages for occupations such as lawyers, teachers, and accountants are less than 50 percent of those of North America and Europe, and

WHEREAS, an analysis of rural clubs in South Africa shows that many have closed and many have fewer than 10 members

IT IS RESOLVED by Rotary International that the Board of Directors of Rotary International consider developing budgets for fiscal years 2019 to 2022 based on a scenario of reducing RI dues to a fixed amount, US\$50, until the next Council on Legislation in 2022. This budget is to be prepared in compliance with the reserve requirements in the RI Bylaws.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT

The purpose of this resolution is to establish how Rotary would have to change to ensure that clubs may remain viable in countries where salaries are significantly lower than in the United States or Europe and where RI dues are significant in relation to the income of a professional person.

> The effect is to establish whether Rotary clubs are viable in all parts of the world or in only those countries or parts of countries where average salaries are above a certain level.

- 1 If a way cannot be found of reducing the cost of Rotary, then the Council accepts
- 2 that Rotary is not a worldwide organization but one that will only exist in certain
- 3 countries or parts of countries where wages are sufficient to support dues.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

- 4 If implemented, this resolution would result in a significant decrease in per capita dues revenues for RI.
- According to the RI Bylaws, the RI annual per capita dues will be US\$68 in fiscal year 2020. Based on current membership levels of 1.2 million members and per capita dues of US\$68, the estimated decrease in revenues is US\$22 million
- 10 beginning in fiscal year 2020.

The RI Bylaws require a balanced budget; therefore, a significant reduction in revenues would have an impact on RI's operations and services.
